RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR HILL COLLEGE'S GRANT APPLICATION FOR COMMERCIAL DRIVER LICENSE SCHOOL

WHEREAS, there is an on-going shortage of individuals with a commercial driver license (CDL) in Johnson County and within this region; and

WHEREAS, jobs that require a CDL are anticipated to grow rapidly; and

WHEREAS, jobs requiring a CDL are essential for every other aspect of the local and national economy, providing an integral link of the supply chain; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Johnson County, by and through its Commissioners Court, that Johnson County does hereby offer this Resolution of Support for Hill College in creating a CDL training program.
