COMMISSIONERS COURT ORDER GRANTING AN EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 262.024, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, FROM THE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 262.023, LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, UPON THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FINDING THAT THE WELCOME VOTER KIOSK VOTER CHECK-IN STATION AND THE VOTESAFE SOFTWARE RUNNING ON THE KIOSK IS AN ITEM THAT CAN BE OBTAINED FROM ONLY ONE SOURCE

The Johnson County Commissioners Court met on November 25, 2019, in regular session for the consideration that the purchase of the Welcome Voter Kiosk voter checkin station and the VoteSafe software running on the kiosk is an item that can be obtained from only one source. The Commissioners Court finds that the Welcome Voter Kiosk voter check-in station and the VoteSafe software running on the kiosk can be obtained from only one source in that Votec Corporation is the only source providing the Welcome Voter Kiosk voter check-in station and the VoteSafe software running on the kiosk and that the Commissioners Court may grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code.

A motion was made by Commissioner Howell, Pct. #2 seconded by Commissioner Stringer, Pct. #3 that that: "The

Commissioners Court finds that the purchase of the Welcome Voter Kiosk voter check-in station and the VoteSafe software running on the kiosk is an item that can be obtained from only one source and that the Commissioners Court grant an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the competitive bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code, and enter an order to that affect, and that the Commissioners Court approve the purchase of the Welcome Voter Kiosk voter check-in station and the VoteSafe software running on the kiosk of Votec Corporation as an item that can be obtained from only one source".

Said motion was approved by a vote of the Commissioners Court on the 25th day of November, 2019.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED:

The Commissioners Court of Johnson County, Texas does hereby enter this order granting an exemption under Section 262.024, Local Government Code, from the bidding requirements of Section 262.023, Local Government Code, upon the Commissioners Court finding that the purchase of the Welcome Voter Kiosk voter check-in station and the VoteSafe software running on the kiosk of Votec Corporation is an item that can be obtained from only one source.
