Order Abating Nuisance at 409 Lariat Ln., Godley, Tx. 76044, Johnson County, Texas

The Johnson County Commissioners Court met on April 13, 2015 in regular session and held a public hearing to consider abatement of a Nuisance at 409 Lariat Ln., Godley, Tx. 76044, Johnson County, Texas.

The Public Hearing was properly conducted after notice and citation to the property owner by Certified Mail. Said notice was delivered on February 17, 2015.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rick Bailey and seconded by Kenny Howell to abate the nuisance by mowing the property, Commissioner picking up the debris and transporting the debris to an appropriate disposal site and by securing the home. The said motion was approved by unanimous vote of the Commissioners Court.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that I, Roger Harmon, Johnson County Judge and we the Commissioners of Johnson County's four precincts do hereby affirm by this vote to abate the nuisance 409 Lariat Ln., Godley, Tx. 76044, Johnson County, Texas by mowing the property, securing the home and removing debris to an appropriate disposal site. The Court authorizes the County Judge's Office to contract with a vendor approved by the Johnson County Purchasing Department to perform the necessary services to abate the nuisance. Furthermore, the Court authorizes the County Judge's Office to continue this action as necessary to prevent the recurrence of the nuisance and to further abate the nuisance at the described location. The Court authorizes said costs associated with the abatement of the nuisance to be paid from general revenue funds. The Court further authorizes the County Attorney's Office to file the appropriate notice on behalf of the Court with the County Clerk to perfect a lien against the property as authorized by Section 343.023 of the Texas Health and Safety Code and that said lien accrue interest beginning on the 31st day after the assessment against the property at the rate of 10 percent a year.
